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ALL SAINTS COLLEGE ORDINANCE 2012 AN ORDINANCE

To establish the All Saints College and for other purposes.

RECITALS

- A. The Parish of All Saints, Ainslie (All Saints) is called into partnership with the rest of the Anglican Communion to be Christ’s continuing presence in the world;
- B. In pursuing the mission of Christ, All Saints is committed to the marks of mission of the Diocese expressed as follows, namely:
 - (a) Proclaiming the Gospel;
 - (b) Providing for the worship of God;
 - (c) Providing for the administration of the sacraments, baptising new believers and teaching and nurturing all believers;
 - (d) Responding to human need through loving service;
 - (e) Seeking to transform the unjust structures of society; and (f) Striving to safeguard the integrity of creation

in ways which are consistent and compatible with Anglican tradition and practice;
- C. As part of its responsible stewardship and missional outreach in loving service and community building, All Saints in conjunction with the Diocese wishes to provide accommodation for tertiary students on part of the land occupied by the Parish of All Saints, Ainslie. The College so formed will provide the opportunity for its members, during their period of residence, to find a greater understanding of the nature of God and the Body of Christ, the Church and to also have the opportunity to be drawn into a closer and active involvement with All Saints Parish in particular or other churches in general; and

The Bishop-in-Council, in its capacity as the Standing Committee of the Synod of the Diocese and in exercise of its powers under the Synod (Delegation of Functions) Ordinance 1998 therefore enacts:

PART 1 - PRELIMINARY

1 Name of Ordinance

1.1 This Ordinance is the All Saints College Ordinance 2012.

2 Dictionary

2.1 In this Ordinance, unless it is clear that another meaning is intended:

Accounting Period means the period of one year ending on each 31 December or such other date as Bishop-In-Council determines;

All Saints means the Parish of All Saints Ainslie;

The Chaplain means the person appointed under Part 8A; ²

the College means All Saints College;

the Council means the Council of the College established by section 4.1;

the Chair - section 12;

the Deputy Chair - section 12;

Financial Year - section 3 of the Finance and Annual Reports Ordinance 2008;

Foundation ³ and **Principles** - section 3;

Resident of the College ⁴- section 28;

Parish Council means the Parish Council of All Saints;

the Warden means the person appointed as Warden under section 26 and includes a person appointed to act.⁵

PART 2 - ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COLLEGE AND THE COUNCIL

3. The College

3.1 All Saints College is established in accordance with this Ordinance.

4 Establishment of the Council

4.1 The Council is established for the purposes of managing the College.

PART 3 - FOUNDATION AND PRINCIPLES OF THE COLLEGE

5 Foundation and Principles

5.1 The College is established as an Anglican residential college for students enrolled in tertiary education institutions in Canberra.

5.2 The College welcomes any student willing to live in harmony with others in a residential college founded on the ethos and principles of the Christian faith in general and the Anglican Church of Australia in particular.

5.3 The aims of the College are to assist in the promotion of sound learning, making fuller provision for care, guidance, discipline and instruction and the formation of character based on the Christian philosophy of life.

PART 4 – POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNCIL

6 Functions of the Council

6.1 The functions of the Council are to:

- (a) establish and maintain, with the Warden, a vision, values and direction for the College which align ⁸ with the mission, vision and values of the Diocese;

- (b) control and govern the College in accordance with this Ordinance and the vision, values and direction of the College;
- (c) maintain the infrastructure of the College;
- (d) do other things necessary or convenient for the conduct of the affairs of the College; and
- (e) do such other things as are approved or referred to it from time to time by an agreement⁹ between the College and All Saints which agreement¹⁰ shall at all times be subject to this Ordinance.

7 General Powers of the Council

7.1 The Council has power to do anything necessary for, or reasonably incidental to, its functions.

7.2 Without limiting the generality of section 7.1, the Council has power to:

- (a) appoint and employ the Warden;
- (b) fix all fees and charges;
- (c) seek donations and raise funds;
- (d) borrow funds within limits approved by Bishop-in-Council;
- (e) pay the costs of all improvements, additions, or alterations to the College and for all furniture, equipment and instruments required by it;
- (f) control all monies received for the purpose of the College and all expenditure necessary for the proper operation and maintenance of the College;
- (g) consult with and to seek direction and advice from time to time from the Bishop-in-Council and the Parish Council in relation to any matter on which the Council considers that it needs advice and/or direction; and
- (h) undertake such other matters as may be referred to it by Bishop-in-Council after it has consulted with the Parish Council;

8 Financial responsibilities

8.1 The Council must not, without the prior approval of Bishop-in-Council, do anything that would result in the total amount of the liabilities of the College at any time exceeding the amount determined by Bishop-in-Council from time to time.

8.2 The monies¹¹ of the College must not be used otherwise than for the objects of and in accordance with the powers of the College.

- 8.3 The College must not make any payment of money or payment in kind to any member of the Council, to any member of a committee established by the Council or to any Member of the College otherwise than for reasonable remuneration as an employee or for reimbursement of reasonable and proper expenses incurred in connection with the business of the College.
- 8.4 All borrowing by the College must be conducted through the Anglican Investment and Development Fund unless the Council can demonstrate to the Fund that a loan can be sourced more economically from another body and that it is in the interests of the Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn to do so.

9 College to operate as part of the Diocese

- 9.1 The College will operate as part of the Diocese and it will take advantage of the economies of scale available to the College as part of the Diocese including:
- (a) common contracts for the supply of goods and services; and
 - (b) services supplied by Diocese agencies including Anglican ¹²Diocesan Services and Anglican Investment and Development Fund including financial services and the supply of staff employed by the Anglican Diocesan Services ¹³

provided that the services so supplied shall be cost effective for the College.

10 Accounts and audit

- 10.1 The College must comply with the requirements of the Finance and Annual Reports Ordinance 2003.

PART 5 – MEMBERS AND MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL

11 Constitution of the Council

- 11.1 The Council comprises:
- (a) The Chair;
 - (b) The Deputy Chair;
 - (c) The Rector of All Saints or his or her nominee;
 - (d) A person elected by the Residents ¹⁴ of the College;
 - (e) Four persons appointed by Bishop-in-Council on the advice of the Parish Council; ¹⁵

(f) Two persons appointed by Bishop-in-Council on the advice of the Council; and ¹⁶

(g) The Warden. ¹⁷

11.2 The Registrar of the Diocese or his nominee may attend Council meetings and may participate in debate and discussion but may not vote upon Council decisions.

11.3 At least two members of the Council apart from the Rector must be members of the Parish Council

11.4 All persons appointed to the Council exercise their membership of Council as individuals and not as a representative of the entities or groups by or from which they are elected or appointed. ¹⁸

12 Appointment of Chair and Deputy Chair

12.1 The Chair and the Deputy Chair shall be appointed by Bishop-in-Council on the advice of the Parish Council.

13 Appointment of a member of the College

13.1 The Resident ¹⁹ of the College referred to in section 11.1(d) shall be elected by the Members of the College through an election process to be decided by the Members of the College.

14. First Council

14.1 Notwithstanding sections 11, 12 and 13, the first Council shall comprise the members of the Governance Group (the Governance Group) appointed by Bishop-in-Council on 13 April 2012 each of whom, other than the Rector of All Saints, shall hold office until 30 April 2015²⁰, but are eligible for re-appointment.

14.2 The Chair of the first Council shall be the person who was appointed by Bishop-in-Council as the Chair of the Governance Group and, as soon as practical after the commencement of this Ordinance, Bishop-in-Council shall appoint a Member of the Governance Group as the Deputy Chair.

14.3 To remove any doubt, if, before the expiry of the terms of office of the members of the first Council set out in subsection 14.1, a Warden is appointed, that person shall, by virtue of their office, become a member of the Council.

- 14.4 To remove any doubt, if, before the expiry of the terms of office of the members of the first Council set out in subsection 14.1, residents²¹ of the College are admitted under section 28, those residents²² shall be entitled to elect a member of the Council in accordance with section 13.
- 14.5 Upon the expiry of the terms of office of the members of the first Council set out in subsection 14.1, and despite section 16, Bishop-in-Council shall, in appointing members of the Council, appoint a Chair and a Deputy Chair, one of whom shall hold office for a term of four years from the date of appointment and the other for a term of two years from the date of appointment, and appoint two of the members appointed under paragraph 11.1(e) to a term of office of four years from the date of appointment and the other two for a term of two years from the date of appointment.
- 14.6 To remove any doubt, all appointments made under this section shall be subject to sections 17 and 19 of this Ordinance.
- 14.7 This section shall expire 7 years after the commencement of this Ordinance.

15 Eligibility for appointment as a member of the Council²⁵

- 15.1 Except with the express approval of Bishop-in-Council a person, other than the Warden, who is employed by the College for remuneration other than for payment of out-of-pocket expenses, whether in a full time or a part time capacity, is not eligible for appointment as a member of the Council.²⁶
- 15.2 A person who has been convicted of an offence involving an assault upon or abuse of a child is not eligible for appointment as a member of the Council.²⁷
- 15.3 In making appointments to the Council Bishop-in-Council shall take into account the need for educational and financial expertise.
- 15.4 A person appointed as a member of the Council must, before taking up office, declare in writing, in a form approved by the Council, that he or she supports the foundation and principles of the College.

16 Term of Office of a member of the Council²⁸

- 16.1 Subject to this section, the terms of office of a member of the²⁹Council is three years with the exception of the member of Council under section 11.1(c) (who is a member while serving as Rector of All Saints) and a person

elected under section 13 whose term of office is 12 months and members of the Council appointed under subsection 14.5.³⁰

Note: *In respect of any nominee of the Rector, s 59 of the Diocesan Legislation Ordinance 2007 empowers an appointment or to suspend or revoke any appointment.*

16.2 Despite paragraph³¹ 16.1 the member³² of Council under section 11.1(c) (who is a member while serving as a Rector of All Saints Parish) shall be a member ex officio.³³

16.3 Despite sub-section 16.1, the terms of office of the members³⁴ of the Council under section 11.3 (d) (who is a member elected by the residents³⁵ of the College) and under paragraph 11.1 (e) who is under subsection 11.3^{36a} member of the Parish Council shall be for 12 months.³⁷

16.4 Subject to being otherwise eligible, members³⁸ of Council appointed by Bishop-in-Council or who are elected under paragraph³⁹ 11.1 (d) are, at the expiry of their term of office, eligible for re-appointment or re-election as the case may be.⁴⁰

17 Vacation of Office

17.1 The office of a member of the Council,⁴¹ other than the Rector or the Warden, becomes vacant when the member:

- (a) dies;
- (b) resigns;
- (c) is absent without the permission of the Council from 3 consecutive meetings of the Council;
- (d) ceases to be eligible for appointment as a member of the Council;⁴²
- (e) becomes, in the opinion of the Council, no longer capable of carrying out the duties of a member of the Council⁴³ due to physical or mental incapacity;
- (f) in the case of the member elected by the Residents⁴⁴ of the College, is removed by a decision of the Residents⁴⁵ of the College; or⁴⁶

- (g) becomes a disqualified person within the meaning of subsection 35.4 of the Governance of the Diocese Ordinance 2000.⁴⁷
- (h)⁴⁸
- (i)⁴⁹

18 Removal of a Member of the Council⁵⁰ from Office

- 18.1 Bishop-in-Council may, at any time and having shown just cause and following due process, remove any member of the Council⁵¹ other than the Rector or the Warden, but including the member elected by the Residents⁵² of the College.
- 18.2 Bishop-in-Council shall before removing any member of the Council, consult with the Council and the Parish Council.⁵³

19 Filling a vacancy in the office of an appointed member

- 19.1 Where a vacancy occurs in an office of a member of the Council⁵⁴ referred to in paragraph⁵⁵ 11.1(a), (b) or (d), Bishop-in-Council shall, on the advice of the Parish Council, appoint a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining term of that office.
- 19.2 Where a vacancy occurs in an office of a member of the Council⁵⁶ elected by the Residents⁵⁷ of the College, the Residents⁵⁸ of the College shall elect a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining term of that office.
- 19.3 Where a vacancy occurs in the office of a member of the Council referred to in paragraph 11.1 (f), Bishop-in-Council shall, on advice of the Council, appoint a person to fill the vacancy for the remaining term of that office.⁵⁹

PART 6 - MEETINGS AND PROCEDURES OF THE COUNCIL

20 Powers of the Chair and Deputy Chair

20.1 The Chair shall:

- (a) subject to section 22.4, preside at all meetings of the Council at which they are present,
- (b) be the public spokesperson for the College; and
- (c) carry out such other duties and have such other powers as shall be decided from time to time by the Council.

20.2 The Deputy Chair has, during any absence or inability of the Chair to perform the functions of the office, or during any vacancy in the office of the Chair, all of the powers and functions of the Chair.

21 Convening a Meeting of the Council

21.1 The Council must hold such meetings as are necessary for the effective performance of its functions.

21.2 Notwithstanding section 21.1, the Council shall meet at least four times a year. 7

21.3 The Chair:

- (a) may at any time convene a meeting of the Council; and
- (b) must convene a meeting of the Council if so requested in writing by such number of other members of the Council as would constitute a quorum. Any request to the Chair to convene a meeting must state the nature of the business to be conducted at the meeting.

21.4 Unless the Chair declares a meeting to be urgently required, at least 7 days' notice must be given to members of the Council of the time and place of a meeting of the Council.

21.5 If a meeting is declared to be urgent in accordance with section 21.4, the meeting may be called at less than 7 days' notice, but as much notice as is reasonably practical in the circumstances must be given to each member.

21.6 Notice of every meeting of the Council, other than a meeting declared to be urgent in accordance with section 21.4, must be accompanied by a written agenda for the meeting and details in writing of the business to be conducted at the meeting.

21.7 The proceedings of any meeting of the Council shall not be invalidated by any irregularity in respect of any notice or by reason of any business being considered which is not included in the agenda or details of business required to accompany the notice.

22 Proceedings of the Council

- 22.1 Subject to this section, the Council may regulate its own procedures.
- 22.2 Each member of the Council, including the person chairing the meeting, may cast one vote on any decision at a Council meeting but if the votes on a matter are equal, the matter shall be decided in accordance with the vote of the person chairing the Council meeting.
- 22.3 A quorum for a meeting of the Council shall be one half of the members of the Council for the time being, or where the number is not a whole number the next larger whole number, but must not be less than three.
- 22.4 The Chair shall preside at each meeting of the Council unless he or she is absent or is unable or unwilling to act.
- 22.5 If the Chair does not preside at a meeting of the Council the Deputy Chair, if available and willing to act presides.
- 22.6 In the absence or unwillingness to act of the Chair and Deputy Chair, the meeting may elect one of its number to preside at its meeting.
- 22.7 The Council may act notwithstanding any vacancy in its membership subject to the continuing membership of the Council being at least half of the total possible membership.
- 22.8 A meeting of the Council may be held by electronic means of communication between the members of the Council or between the members of the Council present together in one or more places and in electronic communication with other members of the Council not so present that reasonably allows each member to hear and take part in the discussion as it happens.
- 22.9 A vote of members of the Council otherwise than at a meeting of the Council may be taken by mail, facsimile transmission, electronic mail, telephone or other means of communication.
- 22.10 A resolution on which a vote is taken in accordance with subsection 22.9 is to be taken to have been agreed to by the Council if a majority of the members of the Council vote in favour of the resolution and must be reported in the minutes of the next meeting of Council.

23 Disclosure of interests

- 23.1 A member of the Council who has a direct or indirect pecuniary interest in a matter being considered, or to be considered, by the Council must, as soon as possible after the relevant facts come to the member's knowledge, disclose the nature of that interest at a meeting of the Council.
- 23.2 The disclosure must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting and, except with the consent of the Council, the member must not:
- (a) be present during any deliberation of the Council in relation to the matter; or

(b) take any part in the decision of the Council in relation to the matter.

23.3 The Council must record in the minutes of the meeting the reason for any consent given under section 23.2.

24 Minutes

24.1 Minutes of all resolutions and proceedings of the Council shall be recorded and shall be retained in the College office. All members of the Council shall receive a copy of the minutes.

PART 7 - COMMITTEES OF THE COUNCIL

25 Committee of the Council

25.1 The Council may form such committees as may be required or desirable for the conduct of the business of the College and delegate to them any of its powers other than this power of delegation.

25.2 Any such committee shall consist of at least one member of the Council and such other persons as the Council may determine.

25.3 The powers and duties delegated to such a committee shall be upon such terms and conditions as the Council may determine including the fixing of a quorum.

PART 8 - THE WARDEN

26 The Warden

26.1 The Council shall appoint a Warden.

26.2 The Council shall not appoint a person to be Warden unless the Bishop agrees to the appointment of the person as Warden to the College. ⁶⁰

26.3 The Warden shall:

- (a) be responsible to the Council for the efficient administration of the affairs of the College and the accommodation and removal of residents;
- (b) have management responsibility for staff of the College; and
- (c) take necessary action, with the Chaplain, ⁶¹ to maintain harmony and discipline among College members including residents in the College and the staff of the College.

26.4 The Warden may remove any resident for a breach of College rules or discipline, and⁶² any resident removed by the Warden may appeal that removal to the Council.

- 26.5 All staff of the College shall be chosen and appointed by the Warden and in him or her shall be vested the power of their appointment, termination or dismissal under terms and conditions approved by the Council.
- 26.6 Action taken by the Warden to appoint or to dismiss staff with supporting evidence of qualifications and reasons for doing so shall be reported by the Warden to the Council.
- 26.7 Any staff member dismissed by the Warden may appeal to the Council and, pending the hearing of any appeal, the staff member concerned shall be under suspension but shall continue to receive salary unless, after having heard from the staff member, the Council for good reason determines otherwise.
- 26.8 The Warden shall provide a written report on the state of the College to each meeting of Council.
- 26.9 The Council may at any time, after consultation with the Bishop, terminate the appointment of the Warden for just cause but only after providing the Warden with natural justice.⁶³

PART 8A – THE CHAPLAIN⁶⁴

27 The Chaplain

- 27.1 The College will have a Chaplain appointed by the Council who will provide Pastoral care and spiritual guidance to the residents.
- 27.2 The Council shall not appoint a person to be Chaplain unless the Bishop agrees to grant the person a licence on appointment as Chaplain to the College.”

PART 9 – MEMBERSHIP OF THE COLLEGE

28 Residents⁶⁵ of the College

- 28.1 The Warden may admit as resident Residents⁶⁶ of the College:
- (a) any undergraduate student engaged in full-time study in Canberra; or
 - (b) any postgraduate student engaged in studies in Canberra.
 - (c) any other person approved by the Council.
- 28.2 The Residents⁶⁷ of the College are the persons who have been admitted under this section.

PART 10 -RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE DIOCESE AND THE PARISH

29 Understanding between the Diocese and the Parish

- 29.1 Subject to this Ordinance and any Agreement⁶⁸ made between the College and All Saints (which Agreement⁶⁹ must be consistent with this Ordinance), the College is established as a part of the All Saints community.
- 29.2 The College may pay an annual fee to All Saints. That fee will be agreed between the College and the Parish Council, taking into account the ability of the College to meet its financial obligations, and will be reviewed annually.
- 29.3 Subject to section 9.1, where it is considered appropriate and convenient the College may arrange the provision of services from All Saints.
- 29.4 If the College ceases to operate as a residential college, alternative uses for the property will be considered by All Saints and the Diocese. The Diocese may only sell the College after consultation with All Saints.

30 Property

- 30.1 The Anglican Church Property Trust Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn is trustee to all real or personal property held for and on behalf of the College.
- 30.2 The College will occupy a portion of the land that is held for use by All Saints which is agreed between the Council and the Parish Council.
- 30.3 Despite the Parochial Property Ordinance 1975, All Saints agrees that, while the College continues to operate, the area occupied by the College under subsection 30.2 is to be used for the purposes of the College and is not to be included in the land held for or used by the parish for the purposes of that Ordinance.
- 30.4 No building works, or alterations to the external façade of buildings of the College, will be made without the permission of the Parish Council.

31 Dissolution

- 31.1 In the event of the College being wound up, the distribution of any surplus assets of the College remaining after the payment of the College's liabilities shall be determined by the Bishop-in-Council.

PART 11 – RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE DIOCESE AND THE COUNCIL

32 Reporting to Bishop-in-Council

32.1 The Chair shall be responsible for ensuring that Bishop-in-Council is kept appropriately informed of the affairs of the College.

33 Bishop-in-Council’s power of direction

33.1 Bishop-in-Council shall at all times have the power to direct the Council in the performance of its responsibilities and powers but may only do so after consultation with the Council and with All Saints.

PART 12 - VISITOR

34 The Visitor

34.1 The Bishop is the Visitor to the College.

34.2 The Visitor will have in respect of the College the powers and functions customarily attaching to the office of the Visitor of a charitable corporation.

PART 13 – AMENDMENT

35 Amendment

35.1 Bishop-in-Council shall not amend this Ordinance Constitution without having first consulted the Council and the Parish Council.
